

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2019-117 - an ordinance authorizing the acceptance of an agreement by and between the City of Joplin and Crawford, Murphy & Tilly, Inc., in the amount of one hundred forty-four thousand three hundred seventy-nine and seventy-two cents (\$144,379.72) for Engineering Design Services for the Relocation of the GA Entrance Road at the Joplin Regional Airport; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. Stanley that Council Bill No. 2019-117 be approved on an emergency basis. Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2019-118 - an ordinance approving the City of Joplin to enter into an agreement with Branco Enterprises Inc., in the amount of Two Million One Hundred Thirty-Nine Thousand One Hundred Forty-Six and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,139,146.00) for construction of the 7th and Illinois Area Stormwater Improvements (TSO606 and TSO607) funded through the Parks and Storm Water Sales Tax; and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. Lawson that Council Bill No. 2019-118 be approved on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2019-058**

Mr. Monteleone introduced Council Bill No. 2019-119 - an ordinance approving the City of Joplin to enter into an agreement with D&E Plumbing and Heating, Inc. in the amount of \$1,067,416.40 for the construction of the Mohaska Trail project; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Monteleone, second by Mr. Cortez that Council Bill No. 2019-119 be approved on an emergency basis. Park Ave. in the City of Joplin, Missouri, for Three Thousand One Hundred and 11/100 Dollars (\$ 3,100.11); providing how the cost thereof shall be paid; how the assessment thereof shall be made; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Brown, second by Mr. Stinnett that Council Bill No. 2019-358 be approved on an emergency basis. Motion by Mr. Stanley, second by Mr. Monteleone that Council Bill No. 2019-507 be approved on an emergency basis. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2019-061**

Starting April 20, the Recycling Center is once again offering FREE Wood Chips. Citizens should bring their truck, trailer and/or containers and City Staff will load these chips for you! Offered at 1702 North Schifferdecker Avenue, this event coincides with the tree limb drop off opportunity from 8 – 2 p.m. on every third Saturday through October.

Another event that draws public interest is the Annual Tire Drop Off set for Friday, May 3 and Saturday, May 4. Hosted by the Recycling Center and Liberty Utilities, automotive passenger tires will be accepted at no charge from Joplin residents, Joplin residential landlords, and Liberty Utilities residential electric customers from 9 am to 3 pm on these days at the Center. Up to ten tires per household will be accepted. Commercial, large truck, tractor, or racecar tires will not be accepted.

Smart Cities is an initiative the City of Joplin is exploring, and we'd like to discuss this with our citizens! We have three Smart Cities Open House sessions at the end of this month, and we invite all ages to please attend one that fits their schedule.
