

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
JULY 1, 2019 MEETING MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

INVOCATION was read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE to the United States of America was led by Mr. Stanley.

ROLL CALL

Answering Roll Call were Council Members: Taylor Brown (via phone), Melodee Colbert-Kean, Keenan Cortez, Doug Lawson, Anthony Monteleone, Diane Reid Adams, Gary Shaw, Ryan Stanley, and Phil Stinnett. Also, in attendance were Interim City Manager Dan Pekarek and City Attorney Peter Edwards.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentations of the Request for Qualifications for the city manager search from the following recruiting companies: Strategic Government Resources (SGR); Management Partners; and The Austin Peters Group. Kristin Navarro represented SGR and Beth Tatarko represented The Austin Peters Group, Inc. An attempt to interview Jerry Newfarmer with Management Partners via phone conferencing was unsuccessful due to technical difficulties. After the presentations, the city council members discussed the qualifications of the companies. Mr. Lawson made a motion to proceed with voting on all three companies and Mr. Stanley seconded the vote. Voting in favor of this motion were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Stanley and Stinnett, 8. Nays: Shaw, 1. Mayor Shaw stated the council members will use the voting board to cast their vote in the following way: the "Yes" button is for SGR; "No" is for Management Partners and "Abstain" is for The Austin Peters Group. Voting in favor of SGR were Council Members: Brown, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 8. Voting in favor of The Austin Peters Group was Council Member Colbert-Kean, 1. There were no votes for Management Partners.

Mayor Shaw opened the Public Hearing

Joe Burtrum, 7192 Gateway Dr, Joplin, appeared in favor of this item, stating he would like to turn this location into a medical marijuana dispensary.

David Glenn, 3310 S. Highland, stated he is neither in favor of or opposed to the item, however, he asked if Schaeffler Corporation (formerly FAG Bearing) had submitted an opinion on this item. He was informed that Schaeffler had submitted a petition of protest for this item.

Wade Carr, attorney for Schaeffler Corporation, spoke in opposition to this item and reviewed the concerns that were listed in the petition of protest submitted by Schaeffler's CEO Bruce Warmbold.

Derek Snyder, 3007 Silver Creek Rd, spoke in opposition to this item and stated he is concerned about the increased traffic and safety of his neighborhood.

Ann Corkle, 3006 Keller Dr., spoke in opposition to this item and stated her concerns regard increased traffic and disruption of a quiet neighborhood.

Dr. Reid Adams introduced Council Bill No. 2019-614 - an ordinance authorizing the City of Joplin to enter into an agreement with Fire Master Fire Equipment, Inc., a Missouri Corporation, for the purpose of purchasing one (1) Ferrara Commercial Medium Rescue Apparatus for the not to exceed price of Three Hundred Eighty- Five Thousand Twenty-Eight and 00/100 Dollars. (\$385,028.00); authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 as adopted by Ordinance 2018-145 on October 15, 2018; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Dr. Reid Adams, second by Mr. Lawson that Council Bill No. 2019-136 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2019-100**

ORDINANCES – FIRST READING

Mr. Stanley introduced Council Bill No. 2019-137 - an ordinance amending Article 10, Traffic Control Devices, of Chapter 114, Traffic, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Joplin by enacting a new Section 114-798, Neighborhood Traffic Calming. Motion by Mr. Stanley, second by Dr. Reid Adams that Council Bill No. 2019-137 be passed on First Reading and advanced to Second and Third Reading. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was read as **Council Bill No. 2019-137**.

Mr. Stinnett made a motion to give a directive to Interim City Manager Pekarek to bring a budget amendment to the next council meeting for the amount equal to the amount that was previously specified for the 36th St. project, so that if CB2019-137 passes at the July 15, 2019 the project can be added to the current paving contract. Mr. Lawson seconded the motion. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 9. Nays: 0.

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2019-615 - an ordinance authorizing the City of Joplin to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (“USFWS”) and Missouri Prairie Foundation, a Missouri Non-Profit Corporation (“MPF”), for the purpose of establishing responsibilities in improving and managing park property into a prairie grass, wild flower, and nature preservation area for a ten (10) year period; and authorizing the Interim City Manager to execute said memorandum of understanding by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mrs. Colbert-Kean that Council Bill No. 2019-615 be passed on First Reading and advanced to Second and Third Reading. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was read as **Council Bill No. 2019-615**

Comments from Council:


Mayor Shaw stated he and Mr. Stanley recently attended the Joplin Police Department's formal badge pinning ceremony at the Public Safety Training Center.

Dr. Reid Adams asked about the status of getting a generator for the new airport terminal. Interim City Manager Dan Pekarek replied the generator at Memorial Hall cannot be moved due to being attained through a grant, however, the city is looking into another grant to acquire a new generator for the airport.
